We are eagerly looking forward to a visit with Mary Evelyn Tucker at our meeting Monday, May 26.

Mary Evelyn is a Senior Lecturer and Research Scholar at Yale University with appointments in the School of Forestry and Environmental Studies, the Divinity School, and the Department of Religious Studies. She teaches in the joint MA program in religion and ecology and directs the Forum on Religion and Ecology at Yale with her husband, John Grim. A pioneer in the field of religion and ecology and an expert in world religions, she has published hundreds of articles, co-authored and edited over 20 books, and co-executive produced the award-winning film, Journey of the Universe with Brian Swimme. She was a close associate of Thomas Berry and a contributor to the Earth Charter.

This session, with renowned scholars Mary Evelyn Tucker and Peter Senge explored the intersection of ecology, Confucian thought, and transformational change. I have just this evening (3/20/3025) finished an extremely important book that has changed my thinking about all aspects of our planet Earth. The book is:

Becoming Earth: How Our Planet Came to Life, by Ferris Jabr.

The Earth is alive, not because life happened on it, but because over millions of years life forms actually created from dead rock the substances of the planet that we know. The planet formed about 4.54 billion years ago, and life possibly began about 4.2 - 3.5 billion years ago, in ocean. The continental crust was forming 4-3 billion years ago, possibly aided by microbes, and the earliest

fossil evidence of life, microbial mats called stromatolites, date from about 3.48 billion years ago.

You can find articles about and interviews with Jabr on You-Tube. You owe it to yourself to expand and re-form your understanding of what this planet is, and what we are, by researching this. Sounding pushy, am I? Well yes, I am pushing us to take this in and be transformed by it.


